



Wraptillion's Heat Patina Collection

A whole new (colorful) look for Wraptillion jewelry.

The Heat Patina collection celebrates how searing heat brings new beauty to the toughest metals. The wonder of science or a metaphor for life – it's all in how you see things.

Commonly asked questions:

What are these pieces made out of?

The same stainless steel engineering components and titanium links as the other Wraptillion collections.

How did they get so colorful?

The stainless steel and titanium are heated to very high temperatures without chemicals, until bronze, blue, and purple tones appear.

Will they turn my skin green?

No! Stainless steel and titanium won't turn your skin a funny color (the way brass, copper, and bronze sometimes do.) The hypoallergenic titanium ear wires are less likely to cause irritation than 24 karat gold (that's why titanium is also used in medical implants). Enjoy the colors without the hassle!

Will each piece look the same?

Because of natural variations in the metals, in the heat distributions, and in other scientific variables, each piece will look similar but will be a little bit unique. (Just like each person's life experience is unique.)

Is this made in some huge factory overseas?

Nope. Designer & maker Kelly Jones links each engineering component to the next to form each piece by opening and closing hundreds of tiny rings, using two pairs of pliers and her own two hands. (No, it isn't quick to do.) Then she heats it for the heat patina process in her own home studio, near Seattle, Washington.
